The Gardener's Notebook from Your Neighbors at Summit Ace

Good watering practices are essential for any garden. Summit Ace Home & Garden Center has a few tips to help with summer watering.

- 1. Water when plants are dry. Simple, yet true. If you aren't sure, feel it! If the soil feels dry, it's time to water. Keep it simple.
- 2. Once your plants are established, give them a good soak once a week (depending on the weather). Plant roots reach out for water as they dry out so a deep watering will help support root growth.
- 3. The best time to water is early in the morning, especially if the weather will be hot. But, if you know you won't get up in time to water before work, don't make mornings your normal watering time. If you choose to water in the evenings, water with enough time for the foliage to dry out before nightfall to help avoid mold and fungus diseases caused by
- 4. Preparation is key to help give your plants an extra boost before

moisture.

a heat wave hits. Try applying a mulch to established plants, but be sure to keep the mulch off of the stems to avoid rotting. Mulch will help keep moisture in the soil. Summit Ace has a few mulch

options in stock! 5. Roots do not like to sit in water, so try

putting rocks or bricks on the tray below to lift the pot up. If you are losing plants that have been watered properly, chances are the roots are overwatered.

6. When it's time to feed, water and then come back at least

30 minutes after watering with a liquid feed solution. Cooler, cloudy mornings and evenings are best for feeding any plant.

In a condescending and taunting barrage of words came the statement toward me, "You are adopted! You are adopted!" Cheryl was only seven years old at the time. Veterans and Active Military Use Their VA Loan Benefit for Homeownership

The VA Home Loan Program was created in 1944 as part of the original Servicemen's Readjustment Act, better known as the GI Bill of Rights. This legislation aimed to aid those who served our country during World War II, and in many ways, it reshaped the course of America. VA loans are backed by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. VA loans are some of the best mortgage programs in the country that benefit current and former members of the Armed Forces. enabling them to find their dream homes. This program can also be utilized by eligible surviving spouses and beneficiaries of veterans.

VA loans provide many advantages to participants. VA loans generally have lower interest rates than conventional loans and other government-backed mortgages. Closing costs are lower and 30-year loans are available. VA loans are even available to those who may have lower credit scores (as low as 550¹). Other perks include the fact that servicemembers and qualified spouses and/or beneficiaries don't have to pay for mortgage insurance or pay a down

payment. In some cases, the funding fee can be rolled into the mortgage for added convenience.

VA loans can also be used towards a home renovation and the loan covers up to \$35,000 of total cost for improvements. Eligible improvements that can be made during a renovation with a VA loan include: remodeling an old kitchen or bathroom, replacing worn carpeting or flooring, removing wallpaper, painting walls, adding energy efficient windows, updating HVAC system, and more.

Summer Brings Pet Issues You'll Want to be Aware of!

There are a few things that I'd like to touch on in this article based on what we have been seeing recently at the clinic this summer. The first thing is the high number of dogs coming in with grass awns

stuck between their toes or embedded in their fur. Grass seeds can also get stuck in the ears and eyes. It's important to check your dog's ears and fur, especially between the toes, after they've been in grass that's gone to seed. If left undiscovered these seeds will burrow deep into their skin and can be extremely hard to retrieve. Some of these seeds have been known to migrate through the skin

and end up in the chest or abdomen with serious consequences.

We have also seen a few dogs this summer with salmon poisoning. Dogs get this when they encounter raw fish from our northwestern rivers. They can get sick just from licking the skin of a raw fish. These include all fish in the salmonid family including Rainbow Trout, Steelhead, Chinook, and Coho. Dogs generally get very sick seven to ten days after exposure. Symptoms include weakness, vomiting and diarrhea along with a high fever. This disease is treatable certain antibiotics.

Summertime is also when we see toxic blooms of blue green algae in some of our local freshwaters. This is relevant to owners of dogs that like to go swimming in lakes, ponds, reservoirs, etc. If the water has a slimy scum forming on the

> surface ranging in colors from yellow, pea soup green or even red then it's best not to let them swim in that water. The slimy algae stick to their fur which is then ingested as the dog grooms itself. The algae contain toxic neurotoxins that can make them very ill and even die. The rule of thumb is "when in doubt, stay the heck out." The Oregon

Veterinary Medical Association posts all major toxic algae advisories on their website oregonvma. org/news/toxic-algae-advisories.

But beyond "stuff," some authors write about the history of particular concepts. French historian Michel Pastoureau has come up with a fascinating series of studies on particular colors.

He has so far published Green, Blue, Black, and Red. I've browsed through Blue

before, and just finished Red. You might think--what can a person say about a color? It turns out, each color has a rich history of its own, and the books are lavishly illustrated with reproductions of paintings, ancient texts and artifacts, making a veritable museum display of the history of the color.

And what, you might think, does the history of a color entail? Lots of stuff. In fact, this is a history of the world, as seen through a red lens. Trivia fans take note! There's lots

of stuff in here that you didn't even know you didn't know. For example, across the whole world, and throughout all time, if a language

has words for three colors, do you know what they are? White, black, and--yep, red is always the third color. What about Judas Iscariot? The Bible says nothing about his appearance, but starting around the year 1000, people started painting him with red hair-and since then, it's stuck. Red has many

connotations, and the book is arranged both chronologically and thematically. As we move through history, red changes from the favorite color, to a controversial color, to a dangerous color. Textiles, heraldry, flags, and traffic signals are all included as artifacts contributing to a deciphering of the meaning of red. Part art history, part world history, and part plain old interesting storytelling, this series of color-histories is a fun and fascinating browse through the human experience.
