

#### Local Dentist Develops COVID Safety for all **Dental Offices**

Dr. V. Kim Kutsch, local dentist, inventor and entrepreneur has developed a new device to protect dental professionals during the COVID pandemic. The biggest risk for dental professionals comes from the aerosol created by the high speed drill, ultrasonic handpiece and air/water syringe. New additional PPE (professional protective equipment) does not completely protect professionals from the aerosol. So Dr. Kutsch and his engineering team (Steve Folin, Bob Cantrell) designed a new extraoral vacuum specifically designed to remove virus sized particles from the aerosol. They started a new company in Albany, Dental Safety First LLC to build these new devices. They designed the vacuum around a custom 99.99% HEPA filter, with a 50 mph nozzle velocity to collect all of the aerosol, then slowing the air velocity down internally to 0.06 mph over the filter media to capture 99.995% of virus sized particles (based on NASA science). This provides the best protection possible for the dental professional from the aerosol. There are several vacuums already available un the US, but this patent pending vacuum is specifically designed for removing virus sized particles. The website is: www.dentalsafetyfirst.com

And it's not just about the COVID virus, in 2017 the CDC released a report identifying that dental professionals are 23 times more likely to develop Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis, a progressive and fatal disease of the lungs believed to be caused by long term exposure to bacterial proteins found in the dental aerosol. COVID has been a wakeup call for the dental profession to treat the biologic aerosol as a serious occupational risk demanding new technologies.

The vacuum is currently being manufactured and installed in dental offices across the country. It is locally being used at Pinnacle Dental Associates and Carson Kutsch Dentistry in Albany, and Adam Kirkpatrick Family Dentistry in Lebanon.

In other COVID news, Dr. Kutsch's other dental manufacturing company in Albany, Oral Biotech, which manufactures the Carifree system of oral healthcare products, produces a rinse being used as a pre-procedural rinse for dental appointments. An ingredient in their antimicrobial fluoride rinse originally designed to treat tooth decay, has been demonstrated in multiple studies this year to be one of the most effective agents to deactivate the COVID virus. Dental practices are utilizing a pre-procedural rinse for every patient as an additional strategy to reduce the pathogenic risk of the aerosol.

## Just because it's Winter, doesn't mean the Fish aren't biting!

Steelhead and salmon abound in several rivers in the area, including the North and South Santiam, the mainstem of the Santiam, and a little farther away in the Alsea and Siletz rivers, and many others.

But if you just want to get away for the day, or just an afternoon with the kids, the mid-Willamette Valley is full of places to go fishing for trout, and some of the best are right here in Albany.

Mitch Smith, owner of Two Rivers Fly Shop in Historic Downtown Albany, says many local waters have been stocked with rainbow trout, some of which tip the scales at several pounds.

"Locally, the state is stocking the heck out of Timber-Linn Lake," Smith said, adding that a couple of weeks ago a man came into his shop who had caught a 9-pound rainbow there. "The state also plants those brooders and they have put some big ones in there."

Along with the normal planting of legal keeper-sized fish (8-inch minimum), the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife plants a few large brood fish – used to collect eggs for spawning more trout at hatcheries – to give the public a shot at landing "the big one."

Albany has a fine selection of easily accessible lakes to fish, making it a perfect place to take the kids, particularly Timber-Linn and Waverly Lakes, which were planted recently. The ODFW has taken down its stocking schedule to keep people from congregating at any one place due to Covid-19 restrictions but is releasing some details about local stocking after the fact. For the latest information about fishing in the Willamette Zone, go to https:// myodfw.com/recreation-report/ fishing-report/willamettezone.

Smith said right now a good bet to take fish is with Powerbait fished just off the bottom, or with Wooly Bugger flies in black, brown or olive on a fly rod or fished behind a casting bubble using spinning gear.





physicians in the 19th and 20th centuries. In fact, before antibiotics, Echinacea was the most widely used herb in medicine. There are plenty of myths, much fiction, and even downright nonsense about the herb Echinacea on the internet. The truth is that Echinacea may be one of the most important herbs in your diet for creating a healthy immune system. Let's look at some facts and fiction:

#### ISN'T IT TRUE THAT ECHINACEA IS NOT **SAFE TO TAKE OVER LONG PERIODS** OF TIME? HASN'T IT BEEN SHOWN TO **LOSE EFFECTIVENESS?**

#### KAREN'S FAMOUS RECIPES

#### Creamy Tomato Pasta

#### **BY KAREN ROGERS**

This is a perfect comfort foodtomato-y, creamy, and full of warming tastes; just right for a cold day. I like to use the pre-diced Abraham brand of prosciutto available in supermarket

delis because it's a bit cheaper and tastes fine. If you can get them, use fresh bay leaves as the difference is huge and they freeze beautifully. I have a small bay tree growing in a pot; it's ten years old and invaluable to me!

Melt 2 tbsp butter in a large sauté pan over medium heat.

Add 3-4 tbsp prosciutto, one medium onion, diced, one large or two small bay leaves, a big pinch of red pepper flakes and cook until the onion gets soft. Add two minced garlic cloves and stir well, about one minute-don't let it brown or burn! Add 2-3 tbsp tomato paste and 4 to 6 chopped sun dried tomatoes (I don't care for the

ones packed in oil). Cook and stir for about a minute and add 1/3 C dry white wine and reduce it to a glaze. If you don't have wine, don't worry, it will taste fine. Add one 14 ounce can diced tomatoes and mix well. Reduce heat, cover and cook about 30 minutes

> until thickenedthe spoon will leave a trail in the sauce.

While this is simmering, bring a large pot of salted water to a boil and cook about 2 C of penne pasta until done to taste. Drain the pasta.

Remove the bay leaves and add about ½ C heavy cream

to the sauce and stir well. Stir in the pasta and mix thoroughly. You can add a small amount of chopped parsley and basil, but don't overdo the basil.

Serve this with some nice crusty bread and sing a song of praise that America gave the tomato to the world!



## Helping Local Families with Furniture and Food





## Having a Problem with Rodents?

Having a problem with rodents? Please consider alternatives to rat bait (rodenticides). Currently there are two major categories of rodenticides.

The first category is a variety of anticoagulants. These cause the animal that ingests them to bleed to death. A dog does not need to ingest very much to become poisoned. A single bait trap may contain enough bait to cause bleeding disorders in dogs. We can however give the dog an antidote

in the form of vitamin K to prevent bleeding while the poison is in his or her system when caught early. We also induce vomiting and give charcoal binders to try to reduce the amount of poison absorbed into the system. Both dogs and cats (and carnivorous wildlife) can also become poisoned by eating rodents that have ingested this poison.

The collateral damage to wildlife is the main reason the Environmental Protection Agency is pulling many of these anticoagulant

poisons in favor of the second category of rodenticide. This category is comprised of one poison, a neurotoxin called bromethalin. There is no antidote for this poison. The EPA is favoring a poison with no antidote because a larger animal such as a dog must ingest a much larger amount of poison to develop symptoms. The amount of bait that is supposed to be placed in a single trap generally does not contain enough poison to cause symptoms. The trouble is that people often pack these traps with more than the recommended amount and put out multiple traps in a single location. The

worst scenario is when a dog gets into the bag/bucket that carries all the bait. Once symptoms develop all we can do is provide supportive care with fluids and try to control their neurological signs with anti-seizure medication.

Dogs that eat enough

bromethalin to become symptomatic can and do die.

So please consider alternatives like

eliminating things that attract rodents, using live traps, blocking access points, or get yourself a good mouser like a Jack Russell Terrier.

decorations, but you will be glad it's there if you need it. While you are at it, consider upgrading your carbon


monoxide detector, especially if you can't remember when you bought the last one. This is an area where an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

#### A Mystery by any other name...

I just finished my first book in John Sandford's mystery series about Virgil Flowers. I'd already read a couple of books about his character Lucas Davenport,

and the Virgil

series seems to

be more of a detective novel, and the Flowers is more of a procedural. All of which made me think--maybe it would be helpful to describe some of the most popular types of mystery novels.

- **Detective/Whodunit:** These are the traditional mysteries in which neither the detective nor the reader know who the killer is. The detective may be a law enforcement agent, a private investigator, or an amateur sucked into the events, but the plot is generally one of looking for clues and figuring out who the murderer is.
- **Procedural:** These novels are probably the most realistic. They appeal to the reader who likes all the details. Often, the detective knows who the killer is, they just need to find enough evidence to convict or they need to hunt down and catch the bad guy. These only work well when the author has done ample research into the detective's line of work: whether that be police officer, CSI investigator, prosecutor, etc.
- **Suspenseful:** Most mysteries have some element of suspense, of course, but there is a certain type that really banks on suspense being the driving force.

In many cases, the bad guy is known, but instead of being a methodical unraveling of clues (as in the procedural), the good guy is usually some kind of amateur and/or victim and may very well wind up dead before they catch up with the bad guy.

 Caper: Not all mysteries are murder mysteries, some involve heists or thefts or other crimes.
 Oddly, many caper novels are written so that the criminals are actually the main characters, and seemingly the "good guys."

In addition to plot types, there are also some very familiar writing styles to look for. Any of the above types can be written in the below styles:

- Cozy: Cozy mysteries are almost always whodunit's, with the following caveat: they do not involve violence, and generally avoid suspense. Originally, they were merely intellectual puzzles to be solved, often by an armchair detective. In the past several decades, they have become increasingly humor-based, with titles often being a pun, and frequently with the series having some kind of theme: cooking, hobbies, sports, paranormal activity, etc.
- **Noir:** Noir is really a mood, but there are certain elements that frequently turn up: terse but clever dialogue, a nihilistic outlook on life, a woman who shouldn't be trusted (maybe a guy in more modern stories), and first-person narrative.
- **Psychological:** Like noir, these frequently have a first-person narrative, and the narrator is usually paranoid or somehow doubting themselves. The story becomes one of "Do I trust myself or the facts that are presented to me?"

Figuring out the style and type of mystery that you most enjoy can help you quickly find new authors to read!
